
# Solving the World's Greatest Puzzle







Nothing else is needed. We know everything that's important to know. Everyone we encounter will know whom we follow because we love each other.

People religiously follow someone who lives and leads like Jesus did.


And therein lies the greatest hurdle.









And Religion has won and Love has lost!






And Jesus still hangs out with "disreputable sinners".

to compiling sixty-six books and countless commentaries on nuances of what God meant by hundreds of commands and circumstances over every conceivable issue currently known to humanity.



I long to be part of the immense eruption of creativity that will take place as people begin to believe they actually can help solve the puzzle.








I will die in peace if I can contribute to freeing Jesus from religion and unlocking the creativity needed for solving the "unloved God/unloved neighbor" enigma in this world.
